Council Members Ann Brown, James Hancock, Jamie Rough, Al Auffart, Steve Pearson and Nancy Cripe met in Regular Session on the 19th day of June 2014 at 8:30 a.m. to conduct business pursuant to the laws of Carroll County and the State of Indiana. Bill Northcutt was absent. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the April 17, 2014 meeting were unanimously approved.

REPORTS:

<u>Treasurer</u>: By the end of May over \$9.3M was collected in taxes. The Treasurer mailed over 140 courtesy letters to taxpayers whose property is eligible for the September tax sale; they have received a good response as the result of the letters.

<u>Auditor</u>: June settlement has been approved by the Auditor of State's office and checks will be mailed soon. A letter was received from the Statewide 911 board explaining why there would be a reduction in the monthly disbursement for the next 3 months, and also that the County would be receiving \$6,912 less in 2015. The Auditor also reported that the Treasurer cashed in the \$100,000 CD for Statewide 911 because the money will be needed to meet the 2014 budget. In 2015, some E-911 expenses will need to be appropriated in another fund such as County General or CAGIT.

<u>Financial Report:</u> James Hancock announced the County could expect to receive at least 7% less in Riverboat funds. Nancy Cripe gave the financial report noting the Treasurer and Auditor were in balance at the end of May. Expenditures to-date should be under 42% at this point; a few departments were over but none were of great concern. Bill Northcutt will give the June financial report.

NEW BUSINESS:

Bosma Stone Quarry Update: Teresa Maxwell gave an informational presentation concerning stopping the proposed quarry near Americus and why it is important to Carroll County that the quarry be stopped.

<u>Drainage Board Member Pay</u>: Surveyor Donald Shockley asked for clarification on Drainage Board Member pay. The Salary Ordinance allows for \$20 per meeting, 12 meetings per year. Due to the increased activity of the Drainage Board, they have met more than monthly and he would like to pay them for the extra meetings. Since the Surveyor's 1st Deputy is also the Secretary to the Drainage Board, there is money in the Secretary line that could be transferred to the board member line to pay them. It was the consensus of the Council that the Drainage Board members be paid for the extra meetings as long as they were advertised public meetings.

PTABOA: Assessor Neda Duff informed the Council about new legislation that prohibited anyone that presently works in the Assessor's Office from serving on the PTABOA. She has a Level II employee that had been serving without pay so she will need to replace that person and will need additional funds to pay that individual. Also, legislation requires there be a Level II person on the Board; there are no other Level II certified individuals in Carroll County. Duff has surveyed surrounding counties; they have Level II certified individuals that could serve, but all make more than the \$80 budgeted. Duff also reported that farm ground assessments went up 13% across the board for 2015.

<u>Surtax/Wheel Tax Ordinance:</u> Jim Hancock went to the BMV to discuss the surtax/wheel tax questions the Council had while setting new rates.
